City of Alameda	Funds will be used for the Oakland-Alameda Estuary Flood Adaptation Project. The project will prevent tidal inundation and will mitigate inland flooding with nature-based solutions.	Alameda County CA	\$3,000
City of Chino Hills	Funds will be used to increase wildfire mitigation and fuel modification efforts to proactively reduce wildfire-related risks that threaten critical infrastructure, habitats, private property and lives.	City of Chino Hills CA	\$1,876
The City of Concord	Funds will be used to make essential improvements, ensuring the building's longevity and efficiency while enhancing regional operational capabilities.	Contra Costa County CA	\$3,000
County of Orange	Funds will be used to reduce the impact of falling rocks at the base of the Dana Point Harbor bluffs to improve the safety to vehicles, vehicle occupants, pedestrians and cyclists along a well-used thoroughfare.	County of Orange CA	\$1,361
Los Angeles County Department of Public Works	Funds will be used to identify permanent measures to mitigate the long-term impact of flooding caused by the limited flow-passing capacity of two road crossings, and nature-based solution measures for the watercourse at and between the crossings. Klondike Canyon Geological Hazard Abatement District	Funds will be used for reducing the amount of rain water entering the earth and removing subterranean rainwater. This will greatly increase the odds of mitigating/stopping the new land movement caused by recent severe storm, saving 107 homes.	Los Angeles County CA	\$4,077
City of Paramount	Funds will be used for upgrades to the emergency operations center to improve the City's ability to mitigate and respond to threats to life, safety, and property that are posed by disasters.	Los Angeles County CA	\$2,100
City of Carson	Funds will be used to help enhance preparedness, strengthen coordination, collaboration, improve communication and information sharing, streamline decision-making, and provide a space to conduct regular training and exercises for our emergency preparedness planning. City of Palm Desert	The funding would provide for the comprehensive technology enhancements required to complete the new EOC. City of Fontana	Funds will be used for a permanent facility for its Emergency Operations Center (EOC).	San Bernardino County CA	\$3,000

San Diego State University	Funds will be used to provide necessary technology equipment and systems to support an on-going and large scale incident requiring a full-staffing of its emergency operations team. The university has an EOC, but lacks dedicated technological equipment and systems to support efficient response.	San Diego County CA	\$128
San Diego County Water Authority	Funds will be used to design a new facility to accommodate its Operations and Maintenance Division. In support of its 23 member agencies, the Water Authority is responsible for a mutual aid group and coordinates emergency water utilities mutual aid within the county.	San Diego County CA	\$1,000
City of Atascadero	Funds will be used to build specific space within the fire station for the EOC and the EOC will require specific technology to be functional. The City is especially vulnerable to hazards and emergencies, especially wildfire risk, given its position within the urban wildland interface.	San Luis Obispo County CA	\$1,500
City of South San Francisco	Funds will be used to expand the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to provide a needed working area to effectively manage protracted and large-scale emergencies such as California fires, flooding and storms.	San Mateo County CA	\$2,000
City of Patterson	Funds will be used to replace the City's outdated Public Safety Center with a new Emergency Operations Center (EOC).	Stanislaus County CA	\$5,000
City of Thousand Oaks	Funds would be used to install a battery energy storage system (BESS) and associated microgrid infrastructure to develop an Emergency Evacuation Center into a fully functional Community Resilience Center (CRC) that can operate off-grid in emergencies.	Thousand Oaks CA	\$3,000
City of Oxnard	Funds will be used for reconstruction of a section of seawalls in Mandalay Bay community.	Ventura County CA	\$2,813
